If you choose to participate in this program, there are two main ways to order. You may use the order form insert in your flier and turn it in to the Market Day box outside of the teacher's lounge or by ordering online at market-day.com. There is also a phone number to order at Market Day directly listed on the order form. I will inform you about the due dates and times for each month. If you have any issues you may call me at 873-1210. I can also place your order, try to help you with any problems you are having, or answer any of your questions. All pick up dates are on Mondays at 4-6pm in our school gym. We combine our orders with the Martin Luther School and Pumpkin Patch Pre School to help increase the profits for each of our schools. The lowest amount we can make is 10% of the sales. We sometimes earn 15% and could potentially earn up to 20%! This is why each and every order, no matter how small, is appreciated. The one thing that I do ask of all participants is that you make arrangements to pick up your orders on the pick-up dates. We have very little freezer space to store your orders. If you do run into a problem, please let me know ASAP! We can work together to figure out a solution. If you are a volunteer, I will be sending you an email as soon as I receive all of my information.
