Principal's Corner

Called To the Water

During the Summer months, I often escape to the waters of Lake Waubesa in McFarland. With my lawn chair, sack lunch, a good book, my hiking boots and often my fishing pole, I sometimes arrive at dawn and claim the end of a dock for a day of taking in the sunshine and enjoying the quiet beauty of the lake. Sometimes the only visitors I encounter are a few ducks floating near the dock, some butterflies or a fish jumping to welcome me to throw in my line. It almost feels like my private lake where I experience a personal sense of awe as I gaze upon the beauty of the still water. Often I am called to moments of prayer as I experience God standing in the midst of the day inviting me to reflect upon His presence in my life.

As I reflect upon this sacred place only eight miles from Stoughton, I am feeling like the Samaritan woman of this upcoming Sunday's Gospel reading. The Samaritan woman came to the well to fetch water. She was tired, thirsty and distraught because of the events that had shaped her life. When she met Jesus, she realized that she had been thirsty and hungry for material things and relationships that were not giving her life or joy. As she fetched water and shared conversation with Jesus, her life was changed. The Samaritan woman courageously began to embrace the power of the Holy Spirit as she began to look at her life's story, sorting out what needed to be left behind so that she could be lead into the future, transformed by the suffering and joy, the love and hate, by the people and events of each day of her new life.

As these next days of Lent unfold, I pray that you, too, may find some quiet reflection time. May you be filled with new life as you pause and reflect upon how you are nourished by the presence of Jesus in your life.
