

Principal's Corner

A Desert Experience

Some of my most memorable vacations in the Southwest part of the United States involved driving through the desert. If you have ever been in a desert, you know that it is an unusual setting. It is hot and there isn't much vegetation that gives relief from the scorching sun. There isn't much water, so you can become thirsty very quickly. And the desert is a very lonely place as you may not find a house or business for hundreds of miles.

Yet, we hear in this Sunday's Gospel reading of Jesus going into the desert for forty days and forty nights. Jesus knows it is going to be very hard to exist in the desert, but he also knows that he wants to be with God and to hear from God what he is to do with his life. Throughout the forty days, Jesus commits himself to the will of His Father. Also while in the desert, Jesus is tempted by the devil to turn away from His Father and his mission. The devil tempted Jesus to focus on things that would give him power and make him famous.

The forty days of Lent is our chance to go into the desert like Jesus did. We are not asked to suffer horrible heat and a scorching sun or thirst and be lonely. During Lent, we are called to pray, fast and give alms. We, too, are called to think about our mission to proclaim the Kingdom of Heaven through our words, actions and our faithfulness to the teachings of Jesus. During Lent, we may be tempted as Jesus was in the desert. We may think about skipping prayer, indulging in the things we promised to give up and may be more concerned about ourselves than we are for others.

Know of my prayers for you as you focus on God's presence in your life during these next forty days of Lent. May you listen deeply in your heart to what God is saying to you so that you can focus clearly on the path of new life that the gifts of Easter will hold.
